conifer	Juniperus horizontalis	Gold Strike	Gold Strike Juniper	6"	N/A	N/A	sun-part shade	The vivid yellow foliage of this spreading Juniper creates a bright, cheery spot in the garden all year. New growth freshens up the cartreuse interior foliage and continues through fall. Low, mounded selection. Protect from scorching sun.
conifer	Picea engelmannii	Blue Magoo	Blue Magoo Spruce	6'	N/A	N/A	sun	Beautiful upright specimen of year round appeal. New spring growth is clothed with short gray-blue needles and characteristically droops creating a lovely weeping appearance.
conifer	Picea pungens	Gebelle's Golden Spring	Gebelle's Golden Spring Spruce	8 - 10'	N/A	N/A	sun	Emerging growth is a stunning vivid, bright soft yellow before fading to a muted blue-green. Plant in a sunny yet protected location to fully benefit the young foliage display.
conifer	Picea pungens	Otto Van Bismark	Otto Van Bismark Spruce	6'	N/A	N/A	sun	A conical upright Colorado Blue Spruce selection noted for its habit, stunning foliage and extreme hardiness to -50 F degrees. Artistic and densely packed steel-blue needles are breathtaking throughout the year and literally "draws ones attention".
conifer	Pinus bungeana	Silver Ghost	Silver Ghost Lacebark Pine	8 - 10'	N/A	N/A	sun	The distinctive exfoliating bark creates an especially prominent and overall light silvery-gray coloration to the trunks. Shiny dark green evergreen foliage and light brown cones add further ornamental appeal.
conifer	Pinus mugo	Sherwood Compact	Sherwood Compact Pine	3 - 6'	N/A	N/A	sun	This miniature boasts short, stiff branches that are heavily clothed with slightly twisted needles to create a gently sculptured surface with rich dark green foliage.

conifer	Pinus parviflora	Cleary	Cleary Pine	4'	N/A	N/A	sun	Beautiful silvery blue needles. Slow growing, compact specimen ideal for mixed borders or dwarf conifer collection.
conifer	Taxodium distichum	Peve Minaret	Peve Minaret Bald Cypress	6'	N/A	N/A	sun-part shade	It forms a dense, compact, pyramidal specimen with lush handsome, soft, dense, "fern-like" foliage which is a pleasing pale green during spring and summer before turning a golden orange in fall.
conifer	Thuja occidentalis	Bailjohn	Technito Arborvitae	6'	N/A	N/A	sun-part shade	Dark green foliage. Forms compact pyramidal outline.
conifer	Thuja plicata	Grovepli	Spring Grove Arborvitea	18-24'	N/A	N/A	sun-part shade	Resistant to deer browsing. Dark-green glossy foliage that maintains color well. Perfect for privacy or well-behaved hedge.
conifer	Tsuga canadensis	Humphrey Welch	Humphrey Welch Canadian Hemlock	5'	N/A	N/A	sun-part shade	A pretty, dwarf upright conifer with gray-green, very tiny needles on slender branches. Easy to grow despite the delicate appearance. Prefers well- drained soil.
conifer	Tsuga canadensis		Canadian Hemlock	30-40'	foliage	N/A	full sun to shade	Oregon grown. Pyramidal growth, branches often droop. Easy to shear into hedge.
conifer	Tsuga diversifolia	Loowit	Loowit Japanese Hemlock	15 - 18"	N/A	N/A	sun	Diminutive short branches and shoots form a tight, congested bun covered with short, blunt needles that resemble green rice grains interspersed with the tiny brown buds.
